FIELD TOWNSHIP CEMETERY RULES

1. The cemetery is open to the public during daylight hours throughout the year. The cemetery building is available for use on scheduling with Clerk.
2. Information regarding lot ownership, transfers, purchases, etc. is available through the office of the Clerk. Issues of concern regarding the cemetery will be addressed by The Field Town Board at regular or special meetings.
3. The Town Board is responsible for maintenance of the property and providing for Caretaker and Sexton.

4. PUBLIC USE AND RESPONSIBILITY

(a) Upon death:

Obtain a properly executed "Transfer Slip" from mortician or government. Arrange for grave site preparation and closing with Sexton. Burial maybe delayed due to frozen ground. If so, a temporary vault location must be obtained. Vaults are optional for permanent interment.

(b) Site Maintenance:

Sexton will place fill, black dirt, grave markers, landscaping and seed. The Caretaker will mow, fertilize and handle weed control. The Board is responsible for the maintenance of the grounds. No other permanent flowers, shrubs, trees or other ornaments are allowed.

(c) Temporary Memorials:

Flags, pots, planters and other ornaments may be placed one week prior to Memorial Day or placed at the time of interment.

Those items may remain on the site for two weeks and will thereafter be removed for grounds maintenance and temporarily stored under the cemetery building steps. Claimants may pick those items up until one week following Labor Day, at which time any items remaining will be disposed.

(d) Grave Site Usage:

One site may have:

1. One casket
2. One casket and one urn
3. Two urns
4. One green burial (bio-degradable casket, shroud or blanket)

Markers need to be professionally set at ground level.

These rules are subject to the development and interpretation of the Field Township Board. Such actions must be noted in township minutes.
